The Club has allocated up to £2,000 for its anniversary grants programme.

All applications will be considered on their merits.

Applications must use the official form though additional information/covering letter etc. is welcome.

NO applications will be accepted after the scheme's official closing date of March 31 2009. However the club does also welcome requests for help from its general funding programme throughout the year.

While the Club cannot help commercial/religious/political organisations, it will accept applications for projects of benefit to the wider community (for instance the Club recently helped towards the cost of chairs for a church hall).

The emphasis of this scheme is to help individuals and organisations in and around the Lancaster and Morecambe area; it may be able to help national and international organisations where there is a local connection.

Privacy: Lancaster and Morecambe Lions Club will treat information supplied in all applications as confidential. However, where an application is accepted it would like to gain publicity for the club and the recipient, especially recipient organisations. This would only be done with the full agreement and co-operation of the grant recipient.

Successful applicants will be notified by the club and officially announced at the Club's 2009 Charter lunch.

The decision of Lancaster and Morecambe Lions Club is final and reserves the right not to give reasons for any decision made.
